





## Scholarship Information:

The Fine Arts Division awards Art scholarships to new freshmen and transfer students who intend to major or minor in Art. Awards are based on the submission of 10-15 electronic images (CD) of the student's recent original works plus two letters of recommendation (if possible one from your high school art teacher). All students, regardless of major, may also qualify for academic scholarships through the Admissions Office from \$5,500 per year to full tuition. Need-Based Financial Aid is also available to students who qualify as a result of filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid
