
What makes the Brevard College Psychology Program unique?

The Psychology major is designed to be a comprehensive program and includes not only intensive academic training, but also an intensive skills training component, early career path exploration and an offering of courses that allow students to concentrate their studies on their most likely career choices. Students are offered a wide-range of internship and research opportunities. Features of the program include:
