The General Science Major is designed for students interested in a broad spectrum of scientific disciplines. A strong base of knowledge is developed from courses in chemistry, physics, biology and geology. Students who intend to continue their studies in graduate or professional school or seek out immediate employment will complete a senior project of their choice based in any of the sciences. Students who intend to teach will complete the professional studies requirements of the Teacher Education Licensure Program.



Teacher Licensure in Science (Grades 9-12)

Students wishing to earn teacher licensure in science must major in General Science, taking all courses required for the General Science Major. Students must also complete the professional studies Component of teacher licensure at the high school level.

You should consider the General Science major if you:

- Have a broad interest in science
- Are interested in teaching science in high school or other educational institutions
- Want to develop reasoning and critical thinking skills
- Desire to pursue a career in science and technology
- Have an interest in a field requiring basic scientific skills
